

# **SATURN URANUS OPPOSITION**

## *Creating A New World Order*

Last month we looked at the potential effects of the mighty Saturn-Uranus opposition in Virgo and Pisces, which begins in earnest this month and will be in effect until July 2010. When these two bodies oppose each other every forty years, we are challenged on a collective level to move beyond the rigidity and dogma of Saturn to embrace the creative vision of Uranus, as the old order collapses around us.

The last time this opposition occurred was mid 1965 to early 1967 when a social revolution changed the course of history, paving the way for long haired hippies, flower power, Woodstock, the Beatles, LSD, student riots and sex, drugs and rock 'n roll. These icons seem a bit tame now to our cool, street-smart, interconnected global economy, but for those who can remember that mid to late sixties period, it was a time of revolution and freedom.

So here we go again – it's time for a new world order. And what will that mean for you? With Pluto in Capricorn forming a backdrop to the Saturn-Uranus opposition, the clear target for meltdown is everything ruled by Capricorn. That means bricks and mortar, the economy, banks, money, governments, big business and any hierarchical or status-ridden structure. In the 1960s, Pluto was in Virgo and the casualty of the Saturn-Uranus opposition was 'morality and values'. Hippies with long hair smoking marijuana with bare breasts and flowery shirts listening to weird music did little harm. The real threat was their refusal to conform to the old way of doing things.

So if non-conformity is on the menu, over the next decade, we have the likelihood of our youth refusing to participate in the Capricorn dream. That means refusing to: buy houses; take out mortgages; obey or even have superiors; get degrees; participate in the superannuation and banking system or kow-tow to business and government rules and regulations. Will there be anarchy? Probably no more so than forty years ago, but things will definitely change.

### **How will it affect you?**

To find out how the Saturn-Uranus opposition will affect you, you have to consult your birth chart to find the positions of Virgo and Pisces.

To do this you need to look up the two houses in your chart ruled by Virgo and Pisces. They will always be opposite each other on the horoscope wheel. There are twelve houses in every birth chart distributed round the wheel like the numbers on a clock. The first house starts at the 9 o'clock point and then the houses are counted round anti-clockwise from there. Houses in a birth chart relate to different areas of life, such as your money, your relationships, your career or your health. We are trying to determine which two areas of your life will be affected by the Saturn-Uranus opposition.

If you are unfamiliar with your chart go to [www.astro.com](http://www.astro.com) and click on 'Free Horoscopes' and then 'Personal Portrait' and 'Add a New Person'. Once you have filled in your birth details you will receive a short horoscope report. Scroll down to the bottom of the page and under the heading 'House Positions', look up the two houses that are listed next to Virgo and Pisces. (To help you understand the language, the Ascendant is the 1<sup>st</sup> house; the Imum Coeli is the 4<sup>th</sup> house; the Descendant is the 7<sup>th</sup> house and the Medium Coeli is the 10<sup>th</sup> house).

Once you know which houses are ruled by Virgo and Pisces, you can refer to the table on the next page to see how you can best use the energies of the Saturn-Uranus opposition. This transit lasts for almost two years, so it's worth making good use of this information. You don't want to be left behind! The house of Uranus is where you need to break free. The house of Saturn will ideally provide a platform to do this.

## **SATURN – URANUS OPPOSITION BY HOUSE POSITION**

House Cusps	Principle	Potential for Development
Pisces on 12 <sup>th</sup> and Virgo on 6 <sup>th</sup>	Practical vs. Spiritual	Using one's ability to organise and create structure to open up to a more spiritual and less structured approach to life. e.g. organising a trip to an ashram; working as a healer combining body and soul.
Pisces on 11 <sup>th</sup> and Virgo on 5 <sup>th</sup>	Personal Creativity vs. Group Contribution	Using one's personal creative talents to serve others in a group environment. e.g. running a music class or theatre group; teaching children; entertaining others.
Pisces on 10 <sup>th</sup> and Virgo on 4 <sup>th</sup>	Home vs. Work	Creating a secure home base from which to display your creative talents to the world. eg working from home; successfully balancing the demands of home and work life.
Pisces on 9 <sup>th</sup> and Virgo on 3 <sup>rd</sup>	Facts vs. Concepts	Applying yourself to study and learning the nuts and bolts of a subject in order to tap into your higher mind and intuitive knowing. e.g. becoming an inspirational teacher; working or travelling overseas to broaden your mind.
Pisces on 8 <sup>th</sup> and Virgo on 2 <sup>nd</sup>	My Money vs. Their Money	Understanding the link between your money and resources and the money and resources of others. Trusting that if you look after your own finances, the universe will look after you. e.g. visiting a financial planner; studying the stock market; investing in a project you care about that benefits others.
Pisces on 7 <sup>th</sup> and Virgo on 1 <sup>st</sup>	Me vs. We	Combining an understanding of the need for personal autonomy and control while embracing the exciting and challenging energy that personal relationships can bring. e.g. allowing your partner more freedom; creating stimulating business relationships with people whose talents are opposite to your own.
Pisces on 6 <sup>th</sup> and Virgo on 12 <sup>th</sup>	Spiritual vs. Practical	Honouring your personal need for solitude and retreat while being open to how you can serve and heal others through your wisdom and understanding. e.g. becoming a counsellor; subtly introducing alternative or spiritual practices into traditional medicine or your workplace.
Pisces on 5 <sup>th</sup> and Virgo on 11 <sup>th</sup>	Group Contribution vs. Personal Creativity	Using your knowledge and experience of group dynamics and your social and professional networks to become more personally creative. e.g. working as a community-based artist; obtaining funding to write your new book or set up a children's group.
Pisces on 4 <sup>th</sup> and Virgo on 10 <sup>th</sup>	Work vs. Home	Making the most of your professional standing and opportunities at work to free your time up at home. e.g. working part time from home; building a home office; moving to the country and working on line.
Pisces on 3 <sup>rd</sup> and Virgo on 9 <sup>th</sup>	Concepts vs. Facts	Using your intellectual authority and knowledge to document your ideas and insights in an original and educational way. e.g. writing a best selling book; bringing complicated concepts to life by making them simple and accessible to all.
Pisces on 2 <sup>nd</sup> and Virgo on 8 <sup>th</sup>	Their Money vs. My Money	Understanding that accessing the money, resources and talents of others in a win-win way can make you personally wealthy and contented. e.g. setting up an investment club; engaging in joint ventures; cashing in your savings and spending the money on something you have always wanted.
Pisces on 1 <sup>st</sup> and Virgo on 7 <sup>th</sup>	We vs. Me	Leaning on the stability of successful, committed relationships and partnerships to free yourself up to greater levels of personal expression. e.g. taking a year off while your partner supports you; going into a new business with a partner; leaving an unfulfilling relationship for greener pastures.
